MINUTES;

The minutes of the August 3, 2015 meeting were approved by motion of Mr. Rametta, second by Mrs. Chvala. Motion carried.

VISITORS:

A motion was made by Mr. Moliterno, second by Mr. Collini, to hear from visitors at this time. Motion carried.

Josh Adams, representative the Apollo-Kiski Little League, addressed Council regarding the use of the little league field at Kennedy Park. Solicitor Loperfito stated that he has reviewed the agreement provided by the aforementioned organization. He stated that the Borough does not normally enter to such agreements regarding the use of the recreation facilities. He stated that these matters are usually worked by the Recreation Committee on a year to year basis.

President Carricato stated that field has had no use the past year, and therefore, welcomes the idea of organized baseball being played on the field. He recommended that the Apollo-Kiski Little League be granted use of this field for the fall of this year, and that during the winter months the particulars of the use of the filed be ironed out.

Bob Dango, 161 Jefferson Street, questioned when the sewer separation project would begin in his area.

President Carricato stated that this project would not take place in this area for some time, if at all.

Mr. Dango requested the adoption of a 15 mph speed limit be enacted for Jefferson Avenue. He stated that there are numerous children playing on the street.

Steve Aulerich, 144 Florida Avenue, requested the patching of portions of his street.


Julie Martin informed Council that the Arts & Crafts Festival will be held on September 26th and 27th.

This fee should be added to the tap-in fee for your municipality and said amount should be remitted to the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority upon collection for a new tap in your municipality.

Pursuant to the Service Agreement between the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority and your member municipality, we are providing you sixty (60) days' notice as required. Please be advised that this new fee shall not become effective until January 1, 2016, at which time you will be required to collect this fee on any tap application in your member municipality.

RESOLUTION 2015-6

A RESOLUTION OF THE KISKI VALLEY WATER POLLUTION CONTROL AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING A TAP FEE IN COMPLIANCE WITH PENNSYLVANIA ACT 57

WHEREAS, the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority is a municipal authority serving 13 municipalities within the Alle-Kiski Valley under and through a Service Agreement with the 13 member municipal communities; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Title 25, Section 71.73 of Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act 57 (commonly referred to as Act 57), the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority is permitted to establish a fee schedule for the cost of municipal services related to implementing the provisions of the Sewage Management Program; and,

WHEREAS, the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority deems that the enactment of a tapping fee which shall include a capacity portion, a distribution or collection portion, a special purpose portion and a reimbursement portion established under and through the limitations and calculations as required by the methodology delineated in Act 57:

NOW THEREFORE, the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority does hereby RESOLVE as follows:

1. RESOLVED, that the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority shall enact, effective January 1, 2016, a fee which shall be referred to as "Tapping Fee - Capacity Portion", pursuant to the requirements of Title 25, Section 71.73 of the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act 57 in the amount of \$510.00 per EDU which shall be subject to the annual review to ensure compliance with the requirements of Act 57 and shall be subject to amendment thereto, by Resolution of the Board of Directors of the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority to maintain compliance with the requirements of Act 57. Said Tapping Fee - Capacity Portion shall be collected by the member communities at the time of a request for a tap fee as presented to the member community and the Tapping Fee - Capacity Portion as identified in this

Resolution shall be remitted to the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority concurrently with the issuance of a tapping permit.

ORDAINED AND ENACTED this 19th day of August, 2015 at Allegheny Township, Westmoreland County by majority vote of the Board of Directors of the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority.

REGULAR & STATED BILLS:

A motion was made by Mr. Rametta, second by Mrs. Chvala, to pay all stated and approved bills. Motion carried.

SPECIAL BILLS:

The Secretary presented a request from Bove Engineering Company to approve the submission of a PennVest Payment Request No. 19 in the amount of \$550,226.60. He stated that this amount reflects the reimbursement of Interest Estimate No. 16 in the amount of \$1,057.14; Engineering Estimate No. 20 in the amount of \$10,000; 2A Construction Estimate No. 18 in the amount of \$210,614.62; 2B Construction Estimate No. 18 in the amount of \$328,554.84.

A motion was made by Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Sciullo, to approve the aforementioned matter. Motion carried with Mrs. Wilson abstaining.

STREET & SANITATION REPORT:

Chairperson Sciullo informed Council that the collection of leaves will be the same as last year. He stated that the residents are to bag the leaves, placed out front of residence, and will be collected on Fridays. Mr. Sciullo stated that the cost of salt for the 2015-2016 winter season is \$78,00 per ton, an increase of 16%.

A motion was made by Mr. Collini, second by Mrs. Christine, to accept the Street & Sanitation Report. Motion carried.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Engineer Michael Bove reported that the installation of piping for Phase 2A is complete, with the restoration phase remaining. He stated that the cost of Phase 2A is over by \$30,000.

Mr. Bove stated that the streets and sidewalks restoration might take an additional \$100,000.00 more than was budgeted and that the alternative would be to scale down the restoration work. He stated that he has a list of areas regarding this matter.

President Carricato recommended that Council have an opportunity to walk the project sites in question before any decision is made. He stated that action can be taken at the October meeting.

Engineer Lucien Bove stated that the CD Street Reconstruction Project should begin within the week. He stated that the contractor is waiting for a milling machine.

Engineer Lucien Bove recommended that additional monies will need to be spend in order to properly perform the work on Delaware Avenue. (See letter from Mr. Bove-page 5-A)

Following a discussion of this matter, a motion was made by Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Collini, to allocate the additional \$6,000 to \$8,000 towards the Delaware Avenue street project.

A motion was made by Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Collini, to approve the aforementioned matter regarding Delaware Avenue. Motion carried with Mrs. Wilson abstaining.

A motion was made by Mr. Sciullo, second by Mr. Moliterno, to accept the Engineer's Report. Motion carried.

BUDGET & FINANCE REPORT:

Chairperson Chvala requested that all budget proposals for the 2016 budget be submitted to the Borough Secretary within the next two weeks.

Delaware Avenue Resurfacing

Dear Steve:

As you know, Council did not approve the patching of the bad areas of Delaware Avenue, but only the resurfacing. Council was hoping to eliminate milling on this road to save money for the soft area repairs. The walk-through field view conducted on August 12th revealed that eliminating milling will not be a good idea. Some areas can be milled only lightly; however, the bad areas need to be milled deeper. Binder will be used in lieu of leveling in bad areas ±1½" thick. Areas that are not bad will not be leveled, but only topped. Please note that we anticipate that it will take approximately ±\$6,000 to \$8,000 more for additional binder so that the wearing may have a better chance of lasting a few years before the soft areas show through.

Solicitor Loperfito stated that there are 33 properties that have not complied with the removal of downspouts from the new sewer system. He stated that he will be advising said owners, by letter, that this must be completed within 10 tens or face receiving a citation for the violation of the ordinance.

Solicitor Loperfito presented for adoption a proposed Ordinance No. 6-2015, amending Ordinance No. 2-2007, to include a Tapping Fee-Capacity Portion Fee established by the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority of \$510.00. He requested Council's authorization to advertise said ordinance for adoption at the October 5, 2015 meeting. (See pages 8-A & 8-B)

A motion was made by Mr. Sciullo, second by Mrs. Chvala, to approve the aforementioned request. Motion carried.

BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFT ORDINANCE 6 of 2015

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFT, COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2 OF 2007, ORIGINALLY ENACTED APRIL 2, 2007 FOR THE PURPOSE OF AMENDING ORDINANCE 7-1973, AS ENACTED ON JULY 9, 1973 AND AS ORIGINALLY CODIFIED IN THE VANDERGRIFT CODE OF BOROUGH ORDINANCES CHAPTER XIX, SEWER AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL, PART 1, SECTION 14, CONDITIONS FOR MAKING CONNECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF AMENDING THE TAPPING FEE TO INCLUDE THEREWITH A TAPPING FEE, CAPACITY PORTION AS ASSESSED BY THE KISKI VALLEY WATER POLLUTION CONTROL AUTHORITY.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Vandergrift adopted Ordinance No. 2 of 2007 on the 2nd day of April, 2007 which established a tap connection fee of \$4,840.00 for each building or structure to be connected to the public sanitary sewer system of the Borough of Vandergrift; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2 of 2007 provided that the Borough reserves the right, from time to time hereafter, to amend any and all taps fees and/or inspection fees as it deems necessary to permit the tap into the Borough or its designated authorities sanitary sewer system; and,

WHEREAS, the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority, under and through their power as a Municipal Authority and Political Subdivision of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania enacted a Tapping Fee – Capacity Portion Fee to be added to sewer tap fees of the 13 Member Communities of which the Borough of Vandergrift acknowledges membership; and,

WHEREAS, the Tapping Fee – Capacity Portion Fee established by the Board of Directors of Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority on the 19th day of August, 2015 was established at \$510.00 per EDU (equivalent domestic unit);

WHEREAS, the Borough enacts this Ordinance pursuant to the powers granted by the Borough Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 8 Pa.C.S. §101, et seq.

NOW THEREFORE, intending to be legally bound, the Borough Council of the Borough of Vandergrift does hereby ORDAIN AND ENACT the following:

SECTION I(B) - PERMIT FOR CONNECTION

The provisions of Section I(B), Permit for Connection, is hereby repealed and replaced with the following section:

SECTION I - PERMIT FOR CONNECTION

B. At the time of application, the applicant shall pay the Borough of Vandergrift, or its designated authority, the required tap connection fee of \$5,350.00 for each building or structure to be connected, by individual tap, to the aforementioned public sanitary sewer system within the Borough of Vandergrift. This tapping fee shall include therewith a tapping fee – capacity portion as levied by the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority in the amount of \$510.00. The Borough shall remit, concurrently with issuance of the tap permit, the sum of \$510.00 to the Kiski Valley Water Pollution Control Authority as required by Kiski Valley Pollution Control Authority Resolution 2015-6.

SECTION II - REPEALER

Any other Ordinance or part thereof which conflicts with the language provided in this Ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent that said language is inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance.

SECTION III - SEVERABILITY

If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is, for any reason, found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid part or portion shall be removed and shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared that it is the intent of the Borough of Vandergrift that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herewith.

SECTION IV - EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be effective on January 1, 2016.
