The Minutes of the April 4, 2016 meeting were approved by motion of Mr. Rametta, second by Mrs. Motion carried

VISITORS:

A motion was made by Mr. Moliterno, second by Mr. Collini, to hear from visitors at this time. Motion carried.

Ashley Hannigan, representing the No. 1 Fire Dept., stated that the Vandergrift No. 1 Fire Department would like permission to use Kennedy Park on the 1st or 2nd week of September for the purpose of holding bike inspection and EMS day.

Don Detar, 213 Lowell Street, requesting that the Borough start taking care of the potholes in town. He also requested that 25 mph signs be installed on Lowell Street.

Frank Souchock, 190 Washington Ave, requested that no action be taken on potholes because they slow traffic on the streets.

Jim Williams, 126 Oregon Avenue, stated that Oregon Avenue is dire need of resurfacing.

Mrs. Wilson stated that the CDBG funds for street reconstruction can only be earmarked for those streets that were within the Phase 2A & 2B Sewer Separation Project. She did stated that Oregon Avenue does need storm drainage and curbing.

Kristin Porter, 106 Hamilton Avenue, questioned whether anything has been done regarding the structure located at 104 Hamilton Avenue.

Solicitor Loperfito stated that a letter has been sent to Gene lagnemma, the owner of said property, advising him to either bring the property into compliance or pursue the possibility of razing the property. He stated that fail to comply will result in the Borough taking legal actions.

Ralph Guyer, 227 Sherman Avenue, addressed Council in regards to obtaining a permit to construct a garage in the rear of his property.

Solicitor Loperfiti stated it's the Borough's position that it is impossible to build on an existing foundation. He recommended that Mr. Guyer file a variance application with the Vandergrift Zoning & Hearing Board since the original garage was razed over four years ago.

None


ENGINEER'S REPORT:


Please find this letter to serve as notification required by 25 Pa Code 127.43a. The 30 day comment period begins upon your receipt of this letter.

TREE & LIGHT REPORT:

Chairperson Wilson reported that she contracted M & M Tree Service to work through the trees on Washington Avenue for the purpose of removing all the dead limbs. She stated that a list of trees to be trimmed and/or removed was given to M & M Tree Service to obtain a quote.

Mrs. Wilson stated that she plans to purchase about five (5) new trees from Musser's Nursery.

A motion was made by Mr. Rametta, second by Mr. Sciullo, to accept the Tree & Light Report. Motion carried.

GENERAL GOVERNMENT REPORT:

President Carricato stated that Casimer Maszgay is interested in serving as the Borough's Code and Ordinance Officer.

A motion was made by Mrs. Wilson, second by Mrs. Chvala, to hire Casimer Maszgay as the Borough's Code & Ordinance Officer. Motion carried.

RECREATION REPORT:

Chairperson Collini reported that steps are being taken have the pool opened for this year. He stated that Mark Newingham will remain as the pool manager. He also stated that there will be about 15 lifeguards employed.

President Carricato questioned whether anything can be done about the high sewage bills being charged to the Vandergrift Pool by the Municipal Authority of Allegheny Twp.

Mr. Rametta stated that there a "deduct water meter" which can be installed that will provide a reading that of water going to the building facility, not the water going into the pool. He explained that billing will only pertain to water usage to the building not to the pool. He stated that this will save the Borough money.

Solicitor Loperfito stated that he will check with the water company about this device.

A motion was made by Mr. Sciullo, second by Mr. Rametta, to accept the Recreation Report. Motion carried.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Loperfito stated that he has not received a signed sales agreement from the Kiski Area Youth Network regarding the sale of the former Vandergrift Senior Citizen Building. If not received by the June 6th meeting, he will recommend that Council rescind Resolution No. 3-2016.

Solicitor Loperfito stated that a letter was send to Mike Langer denying his request to vacate an alley situate behind Franklin Avenue.

Solicitor Loperfito stated that a letter was send to Norfolk Southern Corporation regarding complaints received about trash being on the railroad property, formally the Sherman Avenue Playground at the end of Franklin Avenue.

Solicitor Loperfito stated that letters were send to Rep. Petrarca & Sen. Brewster requesting financial assistance for the Vandergrift Pool.

President Carricato informed Council that letters will be sent to Rep. Petrarca, Sen. Brewster and County Commissioner Kopis regarding Kiski Area School District joining the County Landbank Program. A motion was made by Mr. Collini, second by Mrs. Chvala, to accept the Solicitor's Report. Motion carried.
