The Minutes of the July 3, 2023 meeting were approved by motion of Mr. Sarno , second by Mr. Holmes. Motion carried.

VISITORS:

A motion was made by Mr. Sarno , second by Mr. Holmes , to hear from visitors at this time. Motion carried.

Lisa Dormire, 226 Franklin Avenue, Chairperson of Arts Festival, expressed her appreciation for the help provided by the Fire Departments, emergency services, the Borough Crew, Officer Gray, and the business who supported this event.

Paula Jones, lanni's Pizza, requested permission to have lights strong across Grant Avenue, from one building to another.

Mr. Sarno stated that permission would need to be obtained from the building owners.

Solicitor Kraft stated that he would also need to check the Borough codes.

Ms. Jones questioned why the two signs at her business, indicating 15 minute pick-up parking, were removed.

Mr. Holmes stated that this type of sign was never authorized by Council. He suggested that she purchase a meter bag, like other businesses, that indicated "Courtesy Parking on behalf on the business establishment. He also stated that these meter bags are not for only the business establishment.

Don Detar, 213 Lowell Street, questioned when the Code Officer will enforce sidewalks being cleared off and the placement of refuse cans on the sidewalks.

A motio was made by Mr. Uskuraitis, second Mr. Holmes, to return to the regular order of business. Motion carried.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Collini stated that is has been a wonderful summer with all the different events held in town. It also stated that it is all about coming together as community, with personal responsibility on everyone's part.

Mayor Collini recommended that anyone who has a problem with a parking meter should contact the Borough Officer, instead of contacting the County Weight & Measure Department or the newspaper.

Mayor Collini stated that vehicles should refrain from parking against the flow of traffic on Borough streets.

Westmoreland County is now accepting applications for the 2024 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. Any municipality or agency that plans to submit a project for 2024 CDBG funding consideration must submit an application to this office by September 30, 2023. The 2024 program year begins May 1, 2024, however all projects must first be evaluated and inspected by CD staff, approved by the Westmoreland County Commissioners and submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for final approval. Therefore, it is essential that the application is submitted to us no later than September 30, 2023.

Prior to submittal, please review the application carefully to ensure that all requested information is included. Incomplete applications will not be considered. If a project was previously submitted and not chosen for funding, a new application must be submitted that contains updated cost estimates, maps, etc. to be considered for 2024 funding. Furthermore, please be aware that HUD has released new low and moderate income survey data based on the American Community Survey 2011-2015 (ACS). A map of all census tracts/block groups is available at https://bit.ly/2RGTeEb. Please review your census tract data carefully, as it may have changed from the last 5-year ACS estimate.





Mrs. Wilson stated that sink hole on Beech Street was determined not to be mine subsidence by the DEP Bureau of Abandoned Mine Reclamation. (See page 4-A)

Mrs. Wilson stated that another sink hole was found on Sherman Avenue. She stated that the problem lies with the deterioration of an old man-hole. She stated that the repairs will cost \$6,974.40 by DC Campbell Plumbing.

A motion was made by Mr. Holmes, second by Mr. Sarno, to approve the \$6,974.40 cost to repair the sink hole problem. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Sarno, second by Mr. Holmes, to accept the Street & Sanitation Report. Motion carried.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Engineer Bove reviewed and commented on items 1 thru 9 of his monthly report. (See page 4-B)

Following concerns raised about a timely completion of the Olmsted Commons Project, Council questioned if an extension to the DCNR Grant would be advisable.

A motion was made by Mr. Holmes, second by Mrs. Wilson, to direct the Borough Engineer to file an extension relative to the DCNR Grant for the Olmsted Commons Project. Motion carried.

The following other action was taken:

A motion was made by Mr. Holmes, second by Mrs. Kessler, to pay West Penn Paving, LLC the amount of \$2,003.28, which represents the 5% retainage due and final payment for 2023 Paving & Patchng Liquid Fuels Project. Motion carried (See Page 4-C)

A motion was made by Mr. Holmes, second by Mrs. Kessler, to approve payment of Estimate No. 1 of \$129,442.58 regarding the 2023 CDBG Street Reconstruction Project, with a 5% retainage withheld. Motion carried. (See page 4-D)

A motion was made by Mr.Uskuraitis, second by Mr.Holmes, pay KGD Contracting the 10% retainage fee of \$7,540.00 for work done for the Pool Renovation Project subject to receiving the appropriate maintenance bond. Motion carried.

As requested, an investigation into a possible mine subsidence problem was conducted by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Abandoned Mine Reclamation (PA DEP-BAMR) on July 21 near 317 Beech Street in Vandergrift Borough, Westmoreland County.

Based on the findings presented in the attached Inquiry Report 2023-07-179, it was determined that the cave hole opening, depression area on Beech Street and cracked sidewalk are not mining related. Therefore, in accordance to our program and the Office of Surface Mining guidelines, no further action is warranted by PA DEP-BAMR at this time.

Please see below my report and requested agenda items for the August 7, 2023 Council meeting.

Engineer Report:

- 1. <u>2023 CDBG Street Resurfacing Project</u> –Work to start in July and will be substantially complete as of 8/2/23.
- 2. 2023 Paving & Patching Liquid Fuels Project Work completed in June.
- 3. <u>Vandergrift Pool Rejuvenation DCED GTR Grant</u> Liner restoration work substantially completed 7/15/23.
- 4. Olmsted Commons Working on the electrical contract requirements, plan and quantities.
- 5. <u>Columbia Avenue Parking Lot Stormwater Mitigation Project</u> Submitted 5 page plan set to WCD, started on requested changes/additions/details and additional plan views, title sheet, etc.
- 6. <u>Unsafe Structures / Conditions</u> Inspected 2 structures for unsafe conditions 419A Hancock and 158 Sherman.
- 7. <u>DCED 2023 Multimodal (MTF) Grant Program Application</u> Submitted 7-28-23 and \$100 application fee paid (due before July 30th).
- 8. <u>714/716 Wallace (former church at corner of Emerson)</u> Request to use existing driveway for new business,
- 9. Beech Street Sink Holes Field inspected street and conditions. Appears to be a water issue undermining the street and affecting the sewer trench backfill. Note that there are 14 waterline break patches on 43rd Street which is uphill of Beech and there are current waterline leaks, and there are several new PA one call markings for excavations. This line is constantly being patched. Basements of homes on Beech have been flooded from past waterline breaks. Also note that PNG replaced gas lines on both sides of Beech Street in 2019 creating numerous water transport paths. The old gas lines were left under the street which may also be collecting and carrying water under the street and sidewalks.

A motion was made by Mr.Sarno, second by Mrs. Wilson, to hire Bethany Allera as an extra police officer serving on a part-time basis for the Borogh of Vandergrift from time to time on a hourly or daily basis as needed. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Sarno, second by Ms. Clayton, to accept the Police & Public Safety Report. Motion carried.

BUILDING & GROUNDS REPORT:

Chairperson Sarno stated that he has contacted J & J Roofing, of whom, stated that he can make tempory repairs at this time and that this can be address in the 2024 budget.

Mr. Sarno stated that the Vandergrift Library has indicated an interest to installing security cameras for the purpose of stopping the theft of books. He stated that the Building & Grounds Committee has no objects and will not be any expense to the Borough.

RECREATION REPORT:

Chairperson Uskuraitis stated that the parents of the youth who applied graffiti markings at the stage at Kennedy Park have agreed to make the necessary repairs.

Mr. Uskuraitis stated that the installation of security cameras at the basketball courts is deterring certain activities.

Mr. Uskuraitis stated that the pool is doing well and the dirt on the liner is now clean. He also stated that the kitchen remodel is done.

Ms. Clayton stated that due to the pool opening late, some people have indicated for the pool to remain open until the end of September.

Ms. Clayton stated that is not feasible due to most of the life guards will be returning to school leaving the facility not properly staffed, and due this time of the year not profitable.

A motion was made by Mr. Holmes, secod by Mr. Jody, to accept the Recreation Report. Motion carried.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Mr. Sarno requested that Council act on the Alle-Kiski Intergovernmental Council blight inventory and plan project through the Westmoreland County Department of Planning & Development. He stated that Borough's share in this project is \$5,178.98 with payments over a two year period on a quarterly basis.

A motion was made by Mr. Sarno, second by Mrs. Kessler, to approver the aforementioned matter. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ms. Clayton questioned if there is a need for a stop sign at Wallace Street.

President Chvala stated that a stop sign was temporarily placed at the intersection and was determined to be an unsafe and hazardous condition during winter weather.

Ms. Clayton stated that she is interested in applying for consultant grant relative to a PA Walk Way.

Ms. Clayton questioned if the Borough can restrict the number of gambling machines/establishments in town.

This questioned was turned over to the Solicitor.

Mr. Holmes stated that he has been contacted by Paradise Energy Solutions regarding the placement of solar panels in certain areas of town, such the roof of the Municipal Building, the roof of the Borough Garage and possibly the roof of the Grand Stand at Davis Field. He stated that this program will reduce electric cost and possibilti provide income from the power company, and therefore, requested Council to apply for grant regarding this matter.

A motion was made by Mr. Uskuraitis, second by Mr. Sarno, to apply for the aforementioned grant. Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT:

A motion was made by Mr. Uskuraitis, second by Mr. Sarno, to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:35 pm.
