MINUTES:

The Minutes of the April 1, 2024 were approved by motion of Mr. Sarno, second by Mrs. Wilson. Motion carried.

VISITORS:

A motion was made by Mr. Uskuraitis, second by Ms. Clayton, to hear from visitors at this time. Motion carried.

Taylor Troiano, 328 Harrison Avenue, questioned when the vet banners will be installed on the streets.

Mrs. Kessler stated the banners will be up by Memorial Day.

Lois Troiano, 328 Harrison Avenue, addressed Council on obtaining approval for the First United Methodist Church to have an event at Kennedy Park. She stated that the church will be sponsoring a Fun Day, which will include a petting zoom games, prizes, bingo and crafts. She stated that the event will be held on August 10th, for 11:00 am to 2:00 pm.

President Holmes stated that an application will need to be filled out along with an insurance certificate.

Debbie Green, 118 Fifteenth Street, stated that there is a problem with dogs running at-large within the 15th Street Park. She stated that people are not picking up after their dogs. She stated the Council needs to enforce the leash act.

Chief Caporali stated that he would have police patrol this area.

Don Detar, 213 Lowell Street, stated that something needs to be done about vehicles parking at the bottom Beech Street, making it difficult to pull out on to Poplar Street.

Dave Spiller, owner of Tommy's Catering on Grant Avenue, requested Council to approve a loading zone in front of his business.

President Holmes stated this request can not be approved as it would open up other business to request a loading zone in from their business.

Mr. Spiller question if there any grants for sidewalk replacements in town.

Mrs. Wilson stated that the sidewalks in town are the responsible of the property owner.

Mr. Spiller questioned how he could obtain a meter bag in front of his business.

President Holmes stated that the placement of meter bag will cost \$10.00 month and he would need to purchase a bag from Myers Print Shop. He also stated that this for courtesy parking only, not only for Mr.Spiller's vehicles.

Brian Hoover, 404 Jackson Avenue, presented his problems with a neighbor across the street, whereby he encountered numberous disagreements, indicated that the neighbor chased him up the street with a hammer.

Solicitor Loperfito stated this is on-going police matter, and recommended that no comments be made by Council.

Bethany Johns, 2042 Dime Road, requested use of Kennedy Park June 23rd, July 14th & 28th, and August 11th and 25th for free fun and food by The Rock Church. She submitted a certificate of insurance for this event. (See page 2-A)

Solicitor Loperfito recommended the structure adhere to set backs within the Zoning Ordinance.


A motion was made by Mr. Uskuraitis, second by Mrs. Kessler, to accept the Secretary's Report. Motion carried.

CODE OFFICER'S REPORT:

The Code Officer Brian Young stated that he issued 23 violation notices and 4 citations during the month of April. He also requested the amount of \$1,000 for various grass cutting problems.

REGULAR & STATED BILLS:

A motion was made by Mr. Uskuraitis, second by Mr. Sarno, to pay all stated and approved bills. Motion carried.

STREET & SANITATION REPORT:

Chairperson Wilson informed Council that the new schedule for trash and recycling collections will begin 6:00 am to 2:00 pm, effective May 13th.

Mrs. Wilson reported that on Cooper Street, hot patch was used to pave a sewer ditch, work was done in-house.

Mrs. Wilson reported that on 30th Street, hot patch was to used pave around a catch basin-work done in-house.

Mrs. Wilson requested the use of Liquid Fuel Funds to pave 1 section 35th Street, and 2 sections on Florida Avenue. She explained that these streets did not qualify using CDBG Funds.

A motion was made Mrs. Wilson, second by Ms. Bruner, to direct the Engineer to prepare specification for repairs to aforementioned streets for advertisement and funding using Liquid Fuel Funds. Motion carried.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Engineer Bove reported that he has not received approval of the 2024 CDBG application.

Engineer Bove stated that the Vandergrift Casino & Library Building Improvement Project is ready to be advertised for bids, to be opened at the June 3 meeting.

A motion was made by Mr. Sarno, second by Ms. Clayton, to advertise the above project for the June 3rd meeting.

A motion was by Ms. Clayton, second Mrs. Wilson, to move with the Grant Avenue & McKinley Crossing Projects for the month of June. Motion carried.

In regards to the M.A.A.T Agreement, he stated that the Borough is not entitled to the sewer tap in fees.

With actions by Council, the Engineer continued reviewing his report. (See page 4-A)

Mrs. Kessler informed Council that Stacy Rimel has resigned her position as a full-time school crossing guard.

A motion was made by Mrs. Kessler, second by Ms. Clayton, to accept Ms. Rimel's resignation. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mrs. Kessler, second by Mr. Uskuraitis, to hire Vianna-Natale Nuscis to the position of full-time school crossing guard, contingent upon passing the background investigation. Motion carried.

Mrs. Kessler stated that Jacob Zepeda has submitted an application for the position of part-time police officer, and therefore, made a motion, second by Ms. Clayton, to hire Mr. Zepeda as an extra police officer serving on a part-time basis for the Borough of Vandergrift from time to time on an hourly or daily basis as needed and this offer is contingent upon passing the background check. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Uskuaritis, second by Mrs. Wilson, to accept the Police & Public Safety Report. Motion carried.

BUILDING & GROUNDS:

Chairperson Sarno stated that he is going to request any individuals in town to sponsor the purchase of benches or trees to place at the Olmsted Commons area.



A motion was made by Ms. Clayton, second by Mr. Uskuraitis, to accept the General Government Report. Motion carried.


RECREATION REPORT:
