STREET & SANITATION REPORT:

Chairperson Sciullo reported that Mack #2 was out of service due to breakage of the wheel springs. He stated that repairs were done by Point Springs at a cost of \$3653.68. He also reported that today, the water pump on the Mack #2 failed and that this will cause another delay in the collection of refuse this week.

Mr. Sciullo stated that there is only about two tons of salt remaining at the garage. He stated that on February 17th, an order for 250 tons was placed but has not arrived to date.

Mrs. Wilson stated that Derry Construction has anti-skid material available for purchase.

Mr. Sciullo stated that this material would not be available for pickup until Monday.

A motion was made by Mr. Rametta, second by Mrs. Chvala, to accept the Street & Sanitation Report. Motion carried.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Engineer Michael Bove stated that the Sewer Separation Project should be completed within 3 to 4 months.

Engineer Lucien Bove reviewed the matter regarding the installation of grease trap within the kitchen at the Vandergrift Pool. (See pages 3-A thru 3-D)

Mr. Rametta stated that he will contact a plumber for the purpose of having the grease trap installed.

Engineer Lucien Bove presented and reviewed his letter to Council regarding Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Revised Regulations and Requirements through DEP and the EPA. (See page 3-E)

Mrs. Wilson informed Council that the Planning Department has approved the inclusion of the second priority list of streets to be reconstructed at a total cost of \$274,000. She stated that Washington Avenue, Delaware Avenue and Columbia Avenue will not be included in the project.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Attached please find information regarding the grease trap which we proposed to be installed at the Vandergrift pool. As you know, this is due to requirements of the Allegheny Township Municipal Authority. The Authority has approved the grease trap as proposed. The Board now needs to have this grease trap installed and inspected by the Authority on or before the opening of the pool and concession area in 2015.

The grease trap will need to be installed by a qualified plumber. I suggest that before ordering the grease trap, a plumber be selected and a site inspection made in order to make sure the selected unit will fit in the area under or near the sink. If you would require our assistance in selecting or working with the plumber to get this equipment installed, please let me know.

Please also note that inspection, maintenance and disposal records must be maintained by the Borough and submitted quarterly to the Allegheny Township Municipal Authority. The Borough will need to determine how they wish to handle the inspection, maintenance and disposal, and the quarterly reports to the Municipal Authority. Options for this will be to perform the maintenance and reporting in-house or by using a service company. Bove Engineering Company does not provide this type of service; however, we can provide a sample reporting form which could be used.

GREASE TRAP SIZING CALCULATIONS

Kitchen Sink, Three Bowl Unit: Each bowl is 15" long x 15" wide x 10" deep (total 45" long x 15" wide x 10" deep) with a 2" drain line

Hand Washing Sink: 11" long x 13" wide x 5" deep with a 11/2" drain line

The calculation is as follows:

(45" x 15" x 10") + (11" x 13" x 5") = 7,465 Cubic Inches

7,465 Cubic Inches divided by 231 Cubic Inches per Gallon = 32.32 Gallons x 75%* = 24.24 Gallons Per Minute

Therefore, use 50 LB., 25 GPM capacity grease trap as manufactured by Zurn, Model No. GT2700-25.

^{*} Dishes displace 25% of the water in the sink; therefore, the drainage load equals 75% of the maximum discharge.

Ref: Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Revised Regulations and Requirements

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Until recently, Vandergrift Borough has not been required to comply with the above referenced regulations which come through DEP from the EPA. These regulations require municipalities to apply for General Permits for the Discharge of Storm Water from their municipal separate storm sewer systems. Please note that combined sewer systems were not required to apply for such permits as the combined sewers are regulated under the CSO regulations. It appears that Vandergrift Borough has been included in what is called the Pittsburgh Urbanized Area. This change has occurred due to the 2010 Census. Our firm is able to assist the Borough in obtaining the required permits and developing the protocol in order to comply with the MS4 requirements. We anticipate that the Borough will receive some form of notification from DEP indicating that Vandergrift will be required to obtain MS4 Permit coverage. In the meantime, we suggest that the municipality be prepared for these regulations. Attached please find a list of frequently asked questions regarding the NPDES MS4 Permits.

POLICE & PUBLIC SAFETY REPORT:

Chairperson Moliterno stated the Committee met for the purpose of discussing the matter on hiring an additional full-time patrolman. He then turned this matter over to President Carricato for explanation.

President Carricato stated that the Police & Public Safety Committee is requesting permission to notify the Vandergrift Civil Service Commission for the purpose of having said Commission creating an Eligibility List for the position of "Patrolman", and to establish a nonrefundable application fee of \$150.00.

A motion was made by Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Sciullo, to approve the aforementioned request. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Rametta, second by Mr. Sciullo, to accept the Police & Public Safety Report. Motion carried.

BUILDING & GROUNDS REPORT:

Chairperson Rametta informed Council that a roof leak at the Borough Garage needs to be repaired. He stated that he has contacted J & J Roofing to address this matter.

A motion was made by Mrs. Wilson, second by Mrs. Chvala, to accept the Building & Grounds Report. Motion carried.

TREE & LIGHT REPORT:

GENERAL GOVERNMENT REPORT:

President Carricato requested that a motion be made to grant permission for the television show "Banshee" to be filmed in the Borough. He stated that filming will start mid- April to the end of August.

A motion was made by Mrs. Chvala, second by Mrs. Wilson, to approve the aforementioned matter. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Sciullo, second by Mrs. Chvala, to accept the General Government Report. Motion carried.

RECREATION REPORT:

President Carricato reported that the Recreation Committee met in regards to the bids received on the purchase of new playground equipment at the Jackson Avenue Playground. He stated that due to the major repair issues at the pool, it was decided to reduce the scope of this project by up to 50% in order to apply funding to the pool. He stated that the Committee is recommending the purchase of only Play Structures No.1 & No. 3, which represents a reduction in bids by about 37%. With the low bidder, Sports & Recreation, he stated that the adjusted bid for the two play structures would be \$56,704.00. He therefore recommended that Council award the purchase of Structures No. 1 & No. 3 to Sports & Recreation.

A motion was made by Mrs. Wilson, second by Mr. Moliterno, to award the purchase of Play Structures No. 1 & No. 3 to Sports & Recreation, the low bidder at \$56,704.00. Motion carried.

President Carricato stated that the Committee has decided to rehab the existing play structure.

Engineer Lucien Bove recommended that Council consider installing some type of edging around the new play structures for protection.

President Carricato stated that the Committee will look into this matter.

A motion was made by Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Sciullo, to accept the Recreation Report. Motion carried.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Loperfito stated that he will need an executive session later in the meeting for the purpose of discussing an on-going litigation matter.

Solicitor Loperfito presented for adoption Resolution No. 3-2015, which increases the zoning variance fee from \$500.00 to \$750.00, effectively immediately. (See page 5-A)

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFT, COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING THE SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR ZONING HEARINGS AND MATTERS PURSUANT TO THE POWERS GRANTED TO THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFT UNDER ORDINANCE 1 OF 1986.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Vandergrift has established, by resolution, a schedule of fees for zoning permits, occupancy permits, sign permits and applications for petitions to amend the Zoning Ordinance or to initiate actions on special exception uses, variances and challenges to the validity ordinance or challenges to the decision of the Zoning Officer before the Zoning Hearing Board; and,

WHEREAS, the rising cost of legal advertising and permitted fees and expenses pursuant to the Municipalities Planning Code have caused the Council of the Borough of Vandergrift to adopt a resolution increasing the required fees in order to keep pace with the economic realities that could have an adverse effect upon the budget of the Borough of Vandergrift and thereby on the health, safety and welfare of the citizenry of the Borough of Vandergrift;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Borough of Vandergrift does RESOLVE as follows:

RESOLVED, this 2nd day of March, 2015, the Borough of Vandergrift does hereby increase applications fees for a special exception, variance, challenge to the validity of the ordinance or challenge to the decision of the Zoning Officer, for hearings before the Zoning Hearing Board of the Borough of Vandergrift to \$750.00, effective immediately.

A motion was made by Mr. Sciullo, second by Mr. Rametta, to adopt Resolution No. 3-2015. Motion carried.

Solicitor Loperfito informed Council that the First Commonwealth Bank has provided the Borough an interest of 2.12% for a loan of up to \$125,000, of which will be used to fund the purchase of the aforementioned play structures and to address the repairs at the Vandergrift Pool. He stated that this loan abound will not require approval of DCED. He also stated that funds from this loan will be drawn down as needed, with interest payments only for the first 6 months and a repayment of the loan for a 54 month period.

A motion was made by Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Rametta, to approve a Small Borrowing Loan in the amount of up to \$125,000.00 from the First Commonwealth Bank at an interest rate of 2.12%. Motion carried.

Mr. Rametta questioned what is going to happen with the former Senior Citizen Building.

Solicitor Loperfito stated that there is a current negotiation with the film company as to their interest in utilizing this building, and therefore, recommended that this matter be put on hold for a period of 30-60 days.

A motion was made by Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Rametta, to accept the Solicitor's Report. Motion carried.

At 7:52 p.m., a motion was made by Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Sciullo, to hold an executive session of Council for the purpose of discussing a litigation matter. Motion carried.

In regards to revenues received from the film company producing the television series, "Banshee", Solicitor Loperfito recommended that these revenues be deposited in a Special Revenue Fund. A motion was made by Mr. Sciullo, second by Mrs. Chvala, to direct the Borough Secretary to create a Special Revenue Fund for the deposit of revenues received from the aforementioned film company. Motion carried.
