Mrs. Wilson reported that the Borough Crew has been busy cleaning the small islands, the Columbia Parking Lot and the lower parking lot. She also stated that the Borough Crew trimmed between 30 to 40 low hanging tree limbs.

Dear Council Members,

We are very excited about the Artfest that is coming up on Sunday, July 31st. We have record numbers of food trucks and vendors, and our lineup for bands is wonderful. We will start the day with Aubrey Burchell, fresh from an appearance from America's Got Talent, and end the day with our very own Lenny Collini and crew. We are very grateful to all those who are donating their time to make this a spectacular event.

The theme that we chose this year, Wonderland, has received a lot of attention from near and far. About a month ago we receive a call from the nationally recognized group, Squonk Opera, asking if they could bring their giant hands inflated art installation to Vandergrift for Artfest. They will be doing interactive demonstrations of these hands throughout the day on Farragut Avenue, adjacent to Just Dance. We have artists and vendors coming from our local communities, but also many from Pittsburgh, Butler, Bedford, and beyond. Engineer Bove presented for approval an invoice from A. Folino Construction in the amount of \$136,255.25 for work performed on the 2022 Street Reconstruction Project using CDBG Funds. (See page 3-A)

In regards to the Casino Theater & Library Roofing replacement project, Engineer Bove presented Change Order Nol 1: Increasing to \$12,300. He explained that this will provide a metal edging, of which, will insure the warranty on the roof material.

Engineer Bove presented Change Order No. 2: decrease project by \$1,200.00.

A motion was made by Mr. Holmes, second by Mr. Uskuraitis, second by Mr. Sarno, to approve Change Order No. 2. Motion carried.

Engineer Bove presented an invoice from Fuller Building Group in the amount of \$82,166.21 for work completed to date on the Casino/Library Roof. (See page 4-A)

In regards to the Timber Sale, Engineer Bove stated that the forester and the Solicitor are working out details for draft agreement.

Engineer Bove stated that there is a possible driveway permit violation at 100 Holmes Street. He also reported that the roof at 122 Franklin Avenue has collapsed and that there is unsafe structure at 1013 Poe Street.

Mr. Holmes stated that the Code Officer is already addressing these issues.

A motion was made by Mrs. Wilson, second by Mr. Holmes, to accept the Engineer's Report. Motion carried.

POLICE & PUBLIC SAFETY REPORT:

Chairperson Holmes stated that Brenda Gray, 808 Holland Street, has submitted a Persons With Disability Parking Place Application. He stated that Mrs. Gray does meet the criteria set forth in the ordinance.

A motion was made by Mr. Holmes, second by Mrs.Kessler, to approve the aforementioned handicap parking place. Motion carried.

Chief Caporali presented that following activity report of the Vandergrift Police during the month of June:

- 5. Issued 24 illegal parking tickets.

A motion was made by Mr. Sarno, second by Ms. Clayton, to accept the Police & Public Safety Report. Motion carried.

BUILDING & GROUNDS REPORT:

Chairperson Sarno thanked Lauril Awnings for repairing the large flag flown at Cooper Street.

Mr. Sarno thanked Mayor Collini for assisting in raising the flag at Kennedy Park.

A motion was made by Mr. Holmes, second by Ms. Clayton, to accept the Building & Grounds Report. Motion carried.

TREE & LIGHT REPORT:

Chairperson Kessler reported that a list of about 30 trees are listed for either removal of dead branches, trimming or removal. She stated that they will be prioritized and that an estimate for the work is being provide by Mr. Altman. (See page 5-A-total tree/zoom report)

Mr. Holmes stated that program could be a win-win for the Borough, being there is no cost to the Borough for planting new trees and sidewalk repairs. He also stated that Council is need to show interest in this program.

July 5 2022 Vandergrift Borough Council Meeting

Tree and Lights Committee

A list of approximately 30 trees are on a list for either removal of dead branches, or necessary trimming where pedestrian or auto traffic is impeded, and where there is a problematic situation with borough trees encroaching on structures. The list is being prioritized, and Mr. Altman will provide an estimate for this work. Limbs which appear to be dead and can cause a danger will be first priority.

A very large tree (trunk is approx.. 3' diameter) located behind 116 Franklin Ave. is dead and branches extend over the alley, on to utility wires and over fences. The tree sits on what is identified as the property of Gas and Oil Leasing, Inc., but may be in a ROW to a gas well that benefits the borough. A representative from Arbormetrics has viewed limbs that fell on to the alley and also became entangled in utility lines. He stated that the power company will remove the fallen limbs and cut the branches back, but the tree will not be removed by West Penn. The ownership of the tree must be determined.

ZOOM MEETING 6/29/2022

Following a discussion at the June meeting regarding the potential for Vandergrift to qualify for potential grants to maintain, remove, and replace borough trees, and to develop a sustainable plan for the borough trees, a meeting was set up between Jeffrey Bergman Senior Director, Community Forestry & TreeVitalize Pittsburgh and Western Pennsylvania Conservancy, and council members Kessler, Holmes, and Clayton, and also Attorney Shea Kraft, and Dante Cellitti, Planning Commission member. We expressed our concerns and he was very open to addressing them. We learned that in addition to the Shade Trees in the borough, there is potential for funding to benefit Project 70. Our solicitor is involved and can help guide us through any liability issues that may arise. Following the meeting, Mr. Bergman forwarded copies of the tree inventory projects done for the communities of Johnstown and Ligonier

Mr. Bergman provided information about TreeVitalize and the work it has facilitated in various communities in Allegheny and Westmoreland Counties. He also provided an introduction to Ned Brockmeyer and Brian Crooks, both certified arborists and urban/rural foresters with DCNR. Both Mr. Brockmeyer and Mr. Crooks have offered assistance to our community to help determine if this is something we may wish to pursue, including a webinar scheduled for July 11.

I recommend that fact finding continue and an informed decision be made in coming months.

Mayor Collini questioned why Council can't adopt an ordinance to have property owners maintain their trees, as the Borough does with high grass.

Mrs. Kessler questioned who owns the property at the rear of 116 Franklin Avenue, where a tree along 9th Street has tree limbs hanging out on to 9th Street and into the electric wires.

Mr. Holmes stated the tree in question lies in the property owned by Andron Kovvarus, of whom, is responsible to resolve this matter.

A motion was made by Mr. Holmes, second by Mr. Sarno, to accept the Tree & Light Report. Motion carried.

BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFT ORDINANCE NO. 1 OF 2022

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFT, COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 404, ARTICLE II OF THE VANDERGRIFT BOROUGH CODE TO PROHIBIT THE PLACEMENT OF CERTAIN ITEMS FOR REFUSE COLLECTION AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION.

WHEREAS, The Borough of Vandergrift is empowered to establish Ordinances to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public and for the benefit of the residents, citizens, and general public of the Borough of Vandergrift by and through the Borough Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at 8 Pa.C.S. Section 101 et. seq.

WHEREAS, in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public and for the benefit of residents, citizens, workers, and general public of the Borough of Vandergrift, limitations and prohibitions regarding the placement of certain items for refuse collection must be established.

NOW THEREFORE, the Borough of Vandergrift does hereby enact and ordain as follows:

1. SECTION 404-4. DEFINITIONS.

Section 404-4 of the Code of the Borough of Vandergrift shall be deleted in its entirety and shall be replaced with the following for clarity and for the purpose of amending the definition of "Rubbish" as defined herein:

The following words, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except in those instances where the context clearly indicates otherwise:

ASHES - The residue from the burning of wood or coal.

COMMERCIAL UNIT - Any grocery store, restaurant, club or fire hall.

DWELLING UNIT - Any room or group of rooms located within a dwelling and forming a single habitable unit with facilities which are used or intended to be used for living, sleeping, cooking and eating.

GARBAGE - All putrescible wastes, except sewage and body waste, including vegetable but excluding recognizable industrial by-products, and shall include all such substances from public and private establishments, except from furniture stores, drugstores, hotels and other businesses; these establishments collect and dispose of their own garbage and refuse, except that grocery stores, restaurants, clubs and fire halls shall be limited to three containers, each having a capacity of not more than 26 gallons.

PERSON - A natural person, firm, copartnership, association or corporation.

REFUSE - Garbage, ashes and rubbish as herein defined.

RUBBISH - All waste materials not included in garbage and ashes, except building rubbish from building construction, household furnishings (including any furniture item, regardless of size, which is upholstered, bolstered, or otherwise constructed with permeable fabric or like-materials, including, but not limited to, mattresses, box springs, sofas, chairs, ottomans, benches, or similar items) and appliances, street refuse, industrial refuse, dead animals, machinery or parts of machinery, vehicles or parts of vehicles or such other waste materials as are not commonly produced in homes.

2. SECTION 404-6. PRECOLLECTION PRACTICES.

Section 404-6 of the Code of the Borough of Vandergrift shall be amended to include a new section – 404-6 (D) – Prohibited Items, as follows:

D. Prohibited Items.

(1) Items that are excluded from the definition of Refuse as defined in Section 404-4 of the Code of the Borough of Vandergrift, including sewage and body waste (except human excreta that is contained within a diaper and sealed within a bag or container), recognizable industrial by-products, building rubbish from building construction, household furnishings (including any furniture item, regardless of size, which is upholstered, bolstered, or otherwise constructed with permeable fabric or like-materials, including, but not limited to, mattresses, box springs, sofas, chairs, ottomans, benches, or similar items) and appliances, street refuse, industrial refuse, dead animals, machinery or parts of machinery, vehicles or parts of vehicles or such other waste materials as are not commonly produced in homes, shall not be placed, or allowed to remain for any amount of time, at points of collection for refuse collection.

3. SECTION 404-8. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

Section 404-8 of the Code of the Borough of Vandergrift shall be deleted in its entirety and shall be replaced with the following for clarity:

Any person, whether as principal, agent or employee, who violates or assists in the violation of any provision of this article or of any regulation of the Council of the Borough of Vandergrift imposed by authority of this article shall be guilty of an offense and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$300 and not more than \$1,000 and costs of prosecution and, in default of payment of fines and costs, to undergo imprisonment for not more than 30 days, provided that, after notice, each day day's neglect to comply with any provision of this article or any such regulation shall be deemed a separate offense and subject in all respects to the same penalty as the first offense, and separate proceedings may be instituted and separate penalties imposed for each day's offense after the first conviction.

- 4. **ENACTMENT.** This ordinance shall be effective upon enactment.
- 5. **SEVERABILITY.** Any part or portion of this Ordinance that is deemed unconstitutional shall be stricken only as to the extent of said language. The balance of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- 6. **CODIFICATION.** The provisions of this Ordinance shall be codified, annually, by update of the Code of the Borough of Vandergrift.

BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFT ORDINANCE NO. 2 OF 2022

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFT, COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 470, ARTICLE IX OF THE VANDERGRIFT BOROUGH CODE TO ESTABLISH A WEIGHT LIMIT ON ARIZONA AVENUE.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Vandergrift is empowered to establish Ordinances to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public and for the benefit of the residents, citizens, and traveling public of the Borough of Vandergrift by and through the powers granted under and pursuant to the Borough Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at 8 Pa.C.S. Section 101 et. seq.

WHEREAS, Title 75 Pa.C.S. Section 4902(a) provides that the Commonwealth and local authorities, with respect to highways and bridges under their jurisdiction, may prohibit the operation of vehicles and may impose restrictions as to the weight or size of vehicles operated on a highway or bridge only when they determine by conducting an engineering and traffic study as provided for in department regulations that the highway or bridge may be damaged or destroyed unless use by vehicles is prohibited or the permissible size or weight of the vehicles is reduced.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Title 75 Pa.C.S. Section 4902(a), school buses, emergency vehicles, and vehicles making local deliveries or pick-ups may be exempted from restrictions on the use of highways imposed under Section 4902(a) of Title 75.

NOW THEREFORE, the Borough of Vandergrift does hereby enact and ordain as follows:

1. SECTION 470-69. WEIGHT LIMITS ESTABLISHED ON CERTAIN STREETS.

Section 470-69(A) of the Code of the Borough of Vandergrift shall be deleted in its entirety and shall be replaced with the following for clarity and for the purpose of adding provisions for Arizona Avenue and First Street:

A. Under and pursuant to Title 75 Pa.C.S. Section 4902(a) of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to drive any vehicle or combination having a gross weight in excess of the maximum prescribed below for the streets or the parts of the street (as the case may be) as follows:

2. SECTION 470-72. PERMITS AND SECURITY.

Section 470-72 (A) of the Code of the Borough of Vandergrift shall be deleted in its entirety and shall be replaced with the following to clarify:

A. Individuals or entities wishing to operate vehicles in excess of established weight limits on restricted-weight Borough roads may apply for a permit to do so on a form provided by The Borough of Vandergrift subject to any and all conditions, requirements and regulations of the Borough of Vandergrift and the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. Said permit application will be referred to the Borough Secretary or other designated decision maker, who shall:

(The balance of Vandergrift Borough Code Section 470-72, namely, subsections A (1)-(3), B and C shall remain unchanged.)

3. SECTION 470-16. VEHICLE WEIGHT LIMIT ESTABLISHED ON FIRST STREET.

Section 470-16 of the Code of the Borough of Vandergrift shall be deleted in its entirety due to the weight limit for First Street being included within the amended Section 470-69(A).

- 4. **ENACTMENT.** This Ordinance shall be effective upon enactment.
- 5. **SEVERABILITY.** Any part or portion of this Ordinance that is deemed unconstitutional shall be stricken only as to the extent of said language. The balance of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- 6. **CODIFICATION**. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be codified, annually, by update of the Code of the Borough of Vandergrift.
