MAY 1, 2017

The Council of the Borough of Vandergrift met in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building at 7:00 p.m., with President Carricato presiding. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited.

MINUTES:

The Minutes of the April 3, 2017 meeting were approved, as corrected, by motion of Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Rametta. Motion carried.

VISITORS:

A motion was made by Mr. Moliterno, second by Mr. Rametta, to hear from visitors at this time. Motion carried.

Don Detar, 213 Lowell Street, stated that he had called PennDot about the drainage problem along Hancock Avenue at the former Medicine Shop. He also requested that a "No Parking" sign be erected by Dommy's Pizza.

Mr. Sciuillo stated that he would look into this matter.

Frank Souchock, 190 Washington Ave., requested that the trees on Washington Avenue be trimmed off the houses. He also stated that something needs to be done about the former Anchor Building on Washington Avenue.

Solicitor Loperfito stated that this property is currently in bankruptcy. He stated that an offer was made on the property, but the trustee did not think it was a valid offer.

President Carricato stated that there may be private investors that may resolve this building as well as those of the lower section of Washington Avenue.

Mr. Souchock commented on the following matters:

1. Curb needs painted by Big Dougs.
2. Stop sign at Custer Ave. is blocked by trees.
3. Vehicles not parking within the designated markings.
4. Permission to remove bricks on 10th Street in order slow traffic via a pothole.
5. Numerous grass cutting issues.
6. Parking problems created due the Winery on Custer Ave.

Mr. Sciuillo stated that he would meet with Mr. Souchock about this matters.

Henry Wilkins, 183 Washington Avenue, addressed Council in regards to dead tree limbs falling from a tree in front of his house.

Solicitor Loperfito stated that the Borough has addressed each time you complained. He stated that limbs will fall when you have high winds.

Mrs. Wilson stated that last year she had 33 trees trimmed on Washington Avenue in order to remove all the dead limbs.

Mr. Wilkins also addressed his concerns about intoxicated individuals coming from the Winery.

A motion was made Mrs. Chvala, second by Mr. Rametta, to return to the regular order of business. Motion carried.

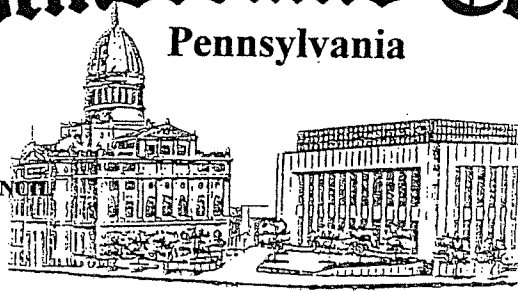

RE: Urban County Qualifications and Requirements-
Community Development Block Grant Program;

Dear Municipal Officials:

In order for Westmoreland County to continue to qualify as an Urban County and in accordance with HUD regulations, we are notifying each unit of government of its options regarding funding through the Community Development Block Grant program for Fiscal Years 2018 – 2020. Those communities that opted-out of the County's Community Development Program three years ago did so for Fiscal Years 2015 – 2017. All municipalities must now make a new decision for the upcoming three (3) year period.

You have the option of either withdrawing or not withdrawing from the County's Community Development Block Grant Program. In considering your options, please keep in mind that if your municipality elects to withdraw from the County's program, the municipality cannot be the beneficiary of any County CDBG funds for a three (3) year period (Fiscal Years 2018, 2019 and 2020).

Conversely, if you choose to be included in the County's program, you cannot apply for Community Development funds under the State CDBG Program for the same three (3) year period. In order to determine if your community would benefit from being included in the State CDBG Program, you need to contact the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED). If you desire to contact the DCED for information on the State program, we can provide the appropriate information.


In addition, if your municipality chooses to be included in the County's program, you will be a participant in the HOME Investment Partnership program, a separate federal program which focuses on housing. Your municipality may not participate in a consortium under the HOME program except through Westmoreland County. This does not mean that your municipality will automatically receive HOME program funds, but that you would be eligible for HOME funded projects to be located in your community.

If you want to continue to be a participant in the County's program, you don't need to take any action or respond to this letter. If you choose to not participate in the County's program, you must inform both the County and the HUD Pittsburgh Area Office (Mr. John E. Tolbert, William S. Moorhead Federal Building, 1000 Liberty Avenue, Suite 1000, Pittsburgh, PA 15222-4004) no later than June 12, 2017. This notice must be in writing and be signed by the Chief Executive Officer.

ORD. NO. 1 of 2017

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE, ADOPT AND ENACT AN ORDINANCE CODIFICATION FOR THE BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFF, COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA; TO PROVIDE FOR THE REPEAL OF CERTAIN LEGISLATION NOT INCLUDED THEREIN; TO SAVE FROM REPEAL CERTAIN OTHER LEGISLATION NOT INCLUDED THEREIN; AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR TAMPERING WITH THE CODE

Be it enacted and ordained by the Borough Council of the Borough of Vandergrift, County of Westmoreland, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and it is enacted and ordained as follows:

ARTICLE I
Adoption of Code

§ 1-1. Approval, adoption and enactment of Code.

Pursuant to Section 3301.5 of the Borough Code (8 Pa.C.S.A. § 3301.5), the codification of a complete body of legislation for the Borough of Vandergrift, County of Westmoreland, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as revised, codified and consolidated into chapters, articles and sections by General Code, and consisting of Chapters 1 through 500, together with an Appendix, is hereby approved, adopted, ordained and enacted as a single ordinance of the Borough of Vandergrift, which shall be known and is hereby designated as the "Code of the Borough of Vandergrift," hereinafter referred to as the "Code."

§ 1-2. Effect of Code on previous provisions.

The provisions of this Code, insofar as they are substantively the same as those of ordinances and resolutions in force immediately prior to the enactment of this ordinance, are intended as a continuation of such ordinances and resolutions and not as new enactments, and the effectiveness of such provisions shall date from the date of adoption of the prior ordinance or resolution. All such provisions are hereby continued in full force and effect and are hereby reaffirmed as to their adoption by the Borough Council of the Borough of Vandergrift, and it is the intention of said Borough Council that each such provision contained within the Code is hereby reenacted and reaffirmed as it appears in said Code. Only such provisions of former ordinances as are omitted from this Code shall be deemed repealed or abrogated by the provisions of § 1-3 below, and only new or changed provisions, as described in § 1-6 below, shall be deemed to be enacted from the effective date of this Code, as provided in § 1-15 below.

§ 1-3. Inconsistent legislation repealed.

Repeal of inconsistent ordinances. Except as provided in § 1-4, Legislation saved from repeal; matters not affected by repeal, below, all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions contained in the Code adopted by this ordinance are hereby repealed as of the effective date given in § 1-15; provided, however, that such repeal shall only be to the extent of such inconsistency, and any valid legislation of the Borough of Vandergrift which is not in conflict with the provisions of the Code shall be deemed to remain in full force and effect.

§ 1-4. Legislation saved from repeal; matters not affected by repeal.

The adoption of this Code and the repeal of ordinances provided for in § 1-3 of this ordinance shall not affect the following ordinances, rights and obligations, which are hereby expressly saved from repeal; provided, however, that the repeal of ordinances pursuant to § 1-3 or the saving from repeal of ordinances pursuant to this section shall not be construed so as to revive any ordinance previously repealed, superseded or no longer of any effect:

- A. Any ordinance adopted subsequent to December 5, 2016.
- B. Any right or liability established, accrued or incurred under any legislative provision of the Borough prior to the effective date of this ordinance or any action or proceeding brought for the enforcement of such right or liability or any cause of action acquired or existing.
- C. Any offense or act committed or done before the effective date of this ordinance in violation of any legislative provision of the Borough or any penalty, punishment or forfeiture which may result therefrom.
- D. Any prosecution, indictment, action, suit or other proceeding pending or any judgment rendered prior to the effective date of this ordinance, brought pursuant to any legislative provision of the Borough.
- E. Any franchise, license, right, easement or privilege heretofore granted or conferred by the Borough or any lawful contract, obligation or agreement.
- F. Any ordinance appropriating money or transferring funds, promising or guaranteeing the payment of money or authorizing the issuance and delivery of any bond of the Borough or other instruments or evidence of the Borough's indebtedness.
- G. Any ordinance adopting an annual budget or establishing an annual tax rate.
- H. Any ordinance providing for the levy, imposition or collection of special taxes, assessments or charges.
- I. Any ordinance authorizing the purchase, sale, lease or transfer of property or acquiring property by acceptance of deed, condemnation or exercise of eminent domain.
- J. Any ordinance annexing land to the Borough.

- K. Any ordinance providing for or requiring the construction or reconstruction or opening of sidewalks, curbs and gutters.
- L. Any ordinance or part of an ordinance providing for laying out, opening, altering, widening, relocating, straightening, establishing grade, changing name, improvement, acceptance or vacation of any right-of-way, easement, street, road, highway, sidewalk, park or other public place or property or designating various streets as public highways.
- M. Any ordinance establishing water, sewer or other special purpose districts and designating the boundaries thereof; providing for a system of sewers or water supply lines; or providing for the construction, extension, dedication, acceptance or abandonment of any part of a system of sewers or water supply lines.
- N. Any ordinance providing for the making of public improvements.
- O. Any ordinance providing for the salaries and compensation of officers and employees of the Borough or setting the bond of any officer or employee.
- P. Any ordinance concerning changes and amendments to the Zoning Map.
- Q. Any ordinance relating to or establishing a pension plan or pension fund for municipal employees.
- R. Any ordinance or portion of an ordinance establishing a specific fee amount for any license, permit or service obtained from the Borough.
- S. Any currently effective ordinance providing for intergovernmental cooperation or establishing an intermunicipal agreement.

§ 1-5. Inclusion of new legislation prior to adoption of Code.

All ordinances of a general and permanent nature adopted subsequent to the date given in § 1-4A and/or prior to the date of adoption of this ordinance are hereby deemed to be a part of the Code and shall, upon being printed, be included therein. Attested copies of all such ordinances shall be temporarily placed in the Code until printed supplements are included.

§ 1-6. Changes and revisions in previously adopted legislation; new provisions.

- A. Nonsubstantive changes. In compiling and preparing the ordinances and resolutions of the Borough for adoption and revision as part of the Code, certain nonsubstantive grammatical and style changes were made in one or more of said ordinances and resolutions. It is the intention of the Borough Council that all such changes be adopted as part of the Code as if the ordinances and resolutions so changed had been previously formally amended to read as such.
- B. Substantive changes and revisions. In addition to the changes and revisions described above, the following changes and revisions of a substantive nature are hereby made. These changes are enacted to bring provisions into conformity with the desired policies of the Borough Council, and it is the intent of the Borough Council that all such changes

be adopted as part of the Code as if the legislation so changed had been previously formally amended to read as such. All such changes and revisions shall be deemed to be in effect as of the effective date of the Code specified in § 1-15.

- (1) In Chapter 317, Occupancy Permits, § 317-3C(7) is amended to insert "inspection" as follows; "Date, if known, when a prior occupancy permit inspection would have been conducted."
- (2) In Chapter 382, Sewers and Sewage Disposal, § 382-29B is amended to insert NOT in "Such costs shall include, but shall not be limited to."

§ 1-7. Interpretation of provisions.

In interpreting and applying the provisions of the Code, they shall be held to be the minimum requirements for the promotion of the public health, safety, comfort, convenience and general welfare. Where the provisions of the Code impose greater restrictions or requirements than those of any statute, other ordinance, resolution or regulation, the provisions of the Code shall control. Where the provisions of any statute, other ordinance, resolution or regulation impose greater restrictions or requirements, the provisions of such statute, other ordinance, resolution or regulation shall control.

§ 1-8. Titles and headings; editor's notes.

- A. Chapter and article titles, headings and titles of sections and other divisions in the Code or in supplements made to the Code are inserted in the Code and may be inserted in supplements to the Code for the convenience of persons using the Code and are not part of the legislation.
- B. Editor's notes indicating sources of sections, giving other information or referring to the statutes or to other parts of the Code are inserted in the Code and may be inserted in supplements to the Code for the convenience of persons using the Code and are not part of the legislation.

§ 1-9. Filing of copy of Code.

At least one copy of the Code in a post-bound volume shall be filed with the Ordinance Book in the office of the Borough Secretary and shall remain there for use and examination by the public. Upon adoption, such copy or copies shall be certified to by the Borough Secretary, as provided by law, and such certified copy or copies shall remain on file in the office of the Borough Secretary, available to persons desiring to examine the same during all times while said Code is in effect.

§ 1-10. Amendments to Code.

Any and all additions, deletions, amendments or supplements to the Code, when passed and adopted in such form as to indicate the intention of the Borough Council to be a part thereof, shall be deemed to be incorporated into such Code so that reference to the Code shall be understood and intended to include such changes. Whenever such additions, deletions, amendments or

supplements to the Code shall be adopted, they shall thereafter be printed and, as provided hereunder, inserted in the post-bound book containing said Code as amendments and supplements thereto.

§ 1-11. Code books to be kept up-to-date.

It shall be the duty of the Borough Secretary or someone authorized and directed by him or her to keep up-to-date the certified copy or copies of the book containing the Code required to be filed in the office of the Borough Secretary for the use of the public. All changes in said Code and all legislation adopted by the Borough Council subsequent to the effective date of this codification which the Borough Council shall adopt specifically as part of the Code shall, when finally adopted, be included therein by reference until such changes or new legislation are printed as supplements to said Code books, at which time such supplements shall be inserted therein.

§ 1-12. Publication of notices.

The Borough Secretary, pursuant to law, shall cause to be published in the manner required a notice of the introduction and of the adoption of the Code in a newspaper of general circulation in the Borough. The enactment and application of this ordinance, coupled with the publication of the notice of introduction, the availability of a copy or copies of the Code for inspection by the public and the filing of an attested copy of this ordinance with the county, as required by law, shall be deemed, held and considered to be due and legal publication of all provisions of the Code for all purposes.

§ 1-13. Altering or tampering with Code; violations and penalties.

It shall be unlawful for anyone to improperly change or amend, by additions or deletions, or to alter or tamper with the Code or any part or portion thereof in any manner whatsoever which will cause the law of the Borough to be misrepresented thereby. Any person who violates or permits a violation of this section of this ordinance shall, upon being found liable therefor in a civil enforcement proceeding, pay a fine of not more than \$600, plus all court costs, including reasonable attorney's fees, incurred by the Borough in the enforcement of this chapter. If the defendant neither pays nor timely appeals the judgment, the Borough may enforce the judgment pursuant to the applicable Rules of Civil Procedure. Each day a violation exists shall constitute a separate offense. Further, the appropriate officers or agents of the Borough are hereby authorized to seek equitable relief, including injunction, to enforce compliance herewith.

§ 1-14. Severability.

The provisions of this ordinance and of the Code adopted hereby are severable, and if any clause, sentence, subsection, section, article, chapter or part thereof shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, invalid or unconstitutional, such judgment or decision shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation and application to the clause, sentence, subsection, section, article, chapter or part thereof rendered illegal, invalid or unconstitutional. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Borough Council that this ordinance and the Code would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid or

unconstitutional clause, sentence, subsection, section, article, chapter or part thereof had not been included therein.

§ 1-15. Effective date.

All provisions of this ordinance and of the Code shall be in force and effect on and after May 1, 2017.




